*Avoid contact with stray animals: (live or dead) and their environment.


*Do not touch surfaces that may be contaminated with droppings.

COLLECTION OF LEARNERS:

SCHOOL FEES:

This is becoming a major problem at school. Learners are reprimanded, but we would appreciate your co-operation by making your child aware of this problem, e.g. at home, while travelling etc.

REGISTER:

Please phone the office/send a message in the homework book if you need to collect your child early. No learner will be allowed off the premises without the parent collecting him/her from the office and signing them out in the early departure register.

STATIONERY:

All parents will receive a stationery list for 2021 and a Walton's Catalogue. Please ensure that the order form is completed and returned to school by the due date. <u>Please note:</u> You do not need to purchase this stationery from Walton's. You may choose your own supplier. The Walton's catalogue will then also assist in familiarizing you with what the product should look like.
