It has been a very challenging term but we as school were still able to maintain high levels of support to all our learners and parents.

To all our valuable parents, learners and staff may you have a wonderful holiday and I encourage you to make use of every moment to ensure a quality day.

ABSENTEEISM:

The high absenteeism rate is a serious matter of concern. It's every child's constitutional right to be in a school and education cannot be withheld from them. Continuous absenteeism is now infringing on the right of children to receive education.

MEDICATION:

If you should need some of your child's medication for home use, we would like you to collect and sign for it from the educators personally. No medication may be forwarded to the school, without it being in the sealed envelope, provided by the office to educators.

Parents to ensure that the school is informed of any new changes to medication.

SICK LEARNERS AT SCHOOL:

Parents need to ensure that learners are taken care of before sending them to school. The school cannot take responsibility for administering medication to sick learners who come to school. Parents will be contacted to collect sick children at the discretion of the educator/staff involved.

Please do not tell your child in the morning that if they feel sick the office needs to phone the parents. These incidents disrupt the class and office constantly; often learners are not sick enough to go home.

SCHOOL FEES:

School fees need to be placed at the top of your budget! Educators need to be paid monthly. The normal running expenses of the school must also be paid.
Please contact Mrs de Villiers and Mrs Pretorius for any queries regarding outstanding fees.

DEBIT ORDER SYSTEM:

This payment method is available at school for your convenience. Parents who would like to use it must contact the office. We also offer a Credit/Debit card option at the Financial Secretary's Office.

UNABRIDGED BIRTH CERTIFICATES:

The decision by the SGB of ZRC to have your child's unabridged birth certificate at school is now a compulsory enrolment document. All learners at ZRC need to have an unabridged birth certificate.

Parents are reminded that a certified copy of the unabridged certificate must be sent to school.

SCHOOL FURNITURE:

Please take note that if your child damages a school desk, chair, or any furniture, or any educational & therapy equipment, the replacement or cost of repairs will be forwarded to the parent for settlement. It is also with great sadness and disappointment to note that we have learners who do not respect the property of the school.

ZRC SCHOOL BUS:

Please note that the ZRC School bus is a privilege and not a right. We are very fortunate to have a fully subsidized bus, but in a case of re-registration etc., we need to remind you that it's the parent's or guardian's responsibility to get your child to school.

Note: Please ensure that bus learners adhere to the school discipline code. Bus learners who do not adhere to this school discipline code will have to sit detention on a Friday, from 12:45-14:00, which means that alternative transport arrangements will be the responsibility of the parents.

IKHWEZI BUS: (PUBLIC TRANSPORT)

We have the use of an Ikhwezi school bus. There is one bus that departs from John Ross College at 06:30 and one which departs at 06:55 Mon to Friday. Tickets available from Ikhwezi ticket office: 035 7976200. Ensure that you monitor your child's behaviour on this public transport. There is a CCTV camera system on the buses. Learners who misbehave will be identified and asked to find alternative transport by the Ikhwezi bus company.

BIRTHDAYS:

Learners are allowed to wear civvies on their Birthday. If the birthday falls on Civvies Day, Weekend, or holiday, they may wear their 'civvies' on the Monday or Friday. Civvies must be sensible and modest. (Girls – no high heels, miniskirts, skimpy shorts, strappy tops, halter necks, dangly earrings etc. Hair must still be neatly tied back).



PARENT MEETINGS/UNSCHEDULED VISITS TO CLASSROOMS:

Parents, please make every effort to attend your appointments made with the educators. It is very important for you to meet and work together with your child's educator to ensure full potential is reached.

Please take note that NO educator will be allowed to leave the class nor take a call during teaching time.

Parents need to make scheduled appointments with the educator in advance. Any parent/visitor at school needs to report to the office and obtain permission to enter the school academic area during the academic day. Parents/Visitors need to respect the professionalism of the educator and we need to safeguard our learners and educators.

LITTER:

This is becoming a major problem at school. Learners are reprimanded, but we would appreciate your co-operation by making your child aware of this problem, e.g. at home, while travelling/walking/jogging etc.

DONATION OF SCHOOL CLOTHES:

We make an appeal to parents to assist with donating school uniform items if your child has outgrown them or if your child is leaving ZRC. This enables us to run a Thrift Shop and assist learners in need.

LOST CLOTHING / PROPERTY:

Please mark every item of clothing, shoes, and stationery clearly. We have lots of 'lost property' which we could return to the learners if items were marked.

LATE COMERS:

Learners coming late – we have continuous problems with leaners arriving late. This has a negative impact on academics. Thank you to those parents who have made an effort to end late arrivals. School starts at 7:30 am. Please be on time.

COLLECTION OF LEARNERS:

Please ensure that your child is collected by 14:00, after which the gates will be locked, and we will not be held responsible for learners who are left on the school premises. An alternative is to enrol your child at the ZRC Aftercare from 14:00 - 17:00.

COMMUNICATION:

All communication between the educator and parent is done in the <u>Homework Book</u>. Please do not write sick notes in the Homework Book. They must be on a separate A4 sheet of paper which will be kept in the child's file in the office.
